Preliminary Program:

Sunday July 8th:

o Arrival of the participants.

Monday July 9th:

- o Start of the World City summit with plenary presentation.
- SmartCityTech meeting with EU participants to get acquainted (SmartCityTech is not only about the collaboration with other continents, but also about collaboration 'intra'-Europe).

• Tuesday July 10th:

o Main conference day on World City Summit (Singapore Water Week, Clean Enviro Summit, SITCE). Participants can freely attend the summits and visit the exhibition.

• Wednesday July 11th: matchmaking EU - Singapore.

- o Pitches and presentations from EU companies and Singapore companies.
- o Individual matchmaking between Singapore & EU companies (B2B Match platform of Enterprise Europe Network to facilitate individual matches).

Thursday July 12th:

Visits to specific organizations in Singapore (to be scheduled):
 Test circuit for autonomous vehicle, Biomass central (Gardens by the Bay), Urban redevelopment agency (past and future of Singapore),
 Block 71 – the start-up site from Singapore.

Budget estimation:

- Flight & hotel: estimation 1.550 Euros (750 Euros flight, 800 Euro hotel 4 nights).
- Conference (details in annex) visiting the exhibition is free (to be cross checked)/attending conference (2.240 Singapore dollars=ca. 1.300 Euro=admission to WCS, SIWW, CES).
- Matchmaking, site tours & network lunches/diners: estimation 800 Euro.
- Total budget: ca. 2.350 Euro (only exhibition, matchmaking, site tours & network lunches/diners), ca 3.650 (in case participant also wants to attend the conference) booth not included.







SmartCityTech

- Mobilizing funding, either public or private money, as key resource to drive SmartCityTech projects forward.
- Going beyond Europe and collaborate on opportunities on other continents.
